Critical Thinking 2025

- Introduced for the <u>first time</u> as an elective for next year.
- Has a High Potential and Gifted (HPG) focus building student abilities in the intellectual (develop the ability to process, understand, reason), creative (use imagination, invention & originality) and social-emotional domain (self-management & relating to & interacting with others).
- Academic subject -> focus is on <u>challenging</u> & <u>extending</u> students
- Aim is to get students to think critically and deeply about issues, provide evidence and reasoning for views and build upon their writing and verbal skills.

applying their critical thinking skills, students will deepen their understanding of content **NSW** skills across many disciplines.

Pattern of study

Core Topics

Both core units will be studied:

- Core unit 1 Critical thinking in action
- Core unit 2 Research skills to support the critical mind

Options

Core units:

- introduce students to the <u>key features of</u> <u>critical thinking</u> (CT), including how CT is distinguished from other models of thinking.
- Students will learn about the process of <u>argumentation</u> & apply it to <u>evaluate claims</u>. Students will also gain <u>practical research skills</u> to collect information from various sources and <u>evaluate their credibility</u>.

Options:

- Student <u>choice</u> to <u>engage</u> areas of <u>interest</u> & reinforce the skills learnt from the core units.
- Allow students to delve <u>deeper into specific</u> <u>scenarios of interest</u>.
- Students will be guided to ask <u>probing</u> <u>questions</u> to <u>strengthen</u> their CT skills & <u>challenge their perceptions</u> of the world.

**After completing the CT elective, students will be ably to apply CT processes to analyse the strength & validity of info & claims - skills which are valuable for learning in Stage 6.


Languages




