INDUSTRIAL ACTION NEXT THURSDAY

The NSW Teachers Federation voted to hold state-wide industrial action in the form of a 24hour strike on Thursday 30 June. While our school will still be open, we will only be providing minimal supervision of students on this date because of the strike. Minimal supervision for us will mean that the large majority of teachers will be offsite and there will be a small number of staff who can supervise students in the Library. For those students who are at school, they will be encouraged to undertake self-directed work such as completing assignments. The Department's learning from home resources will be available to all students for ongoing curriculum support. All students who are absent due to the strike will be marked as 'explained'. The display is a depiction of the experiences of students who are refugees settled in Australia, and includes both artworks and creative writing from Forest High students.
