Principal's Report

At The Forest High School we have had a really positive start to the 2015 school year. I extend a warm welcome to everyone, particularly new staff and students. I hope you all had a restful and productive holiday.

Staffing update

A number of new staff have commenced at The Forest this year. Ms. Denise Wright has been appointed Deputy Principal, as Mrs. Jane Dean retired at the end of last year. We were sad to farewell Mrs. Dean, but very excited to have such an experienced Deputy appointed to the school. Ms. Wright brings a wealth of curriculum knowledge and skill to the position, having six years' experience as a Deputy in regional schools and four years' experience with the Board of Studies.

Two new Head Teachers have joined to staff; Mrs. Karen Gourlay was appointed Head Teacher Mathematics, replacing Mr. David Sizeland who retired this year after almost six years at the school and Ms. Sue Warnes was appointed as Head Teacher Support. Three new classroom teachers have been permanently appointed; Mr. John Brennan in HSIE, Mr. Leslie Pitt in PD/H/PE and Miss Dorothy Lee, Support Teacher. Additionally we welcomed Mrs. Leah Barry, Mathematics and Mr. Peter Hamilton, HSIE back from leave and four temporary teachers have joined us, Mr. James Moore and Mrs. Roz Beaver in Music, Mrs. Judy Spicer in Languages and Mr. Graeme Smith in TAS. All these teachers add a depth of skill and knowledge to our school.

Properties update

Our 21st Century learning room, that was completed at the end of 2014, is successfully up and running and is proving to be a very popular teaching and learning space. In addition to being spacious, bright and colourful, the space provides access to innovative technology in a flexible environment that allows for collaborative as well as individual learning. The room will be showcased for new parents at our next P&C meeting.



Refurbishment of the Hall change rooms and toilets is underway and will provide new amenities for students and the community. Two new outdoor learning and leisure areas are under construction for the students behind D Block and near the basketball courts. The court fencing is also being replaced and new landscaping has been added to several areas of the

school. Additionally eight classrooms will be repainted and carpeted in the next holidays.

Hospital and roads update

Discussions with Health Infrastructure and RMS are continuing and I hope to have diagrams and photographs ready to display this term. RMS will be undertaking remediation work to the school car parks and making improvements and enhancements to our grounds. These works will significantly improve the infrastructure of the school.

We continue to have an excellent relationship with Health Infrastructure with opportunities for regular, ongoing consultation. We hope to form some strong curricular and extra-curricular links with the hospital, which will significantly enhance opportunities for our students.

NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM - 2015

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2015 the following vaccines will be offered:

Year 7 students*

- dTpa vaccine (Diphtheria, Tetanus & Pertussis (whooping cough) as a single dose
- Varicella vaccine (chickenpox) as a single dose; and

• Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine in a 3-dose schedule at 0, 2 and 6 months (*students who commence HPV vaccination in Year 7 but do not complete the course may be offered catch-up doses at school in Year 8*)

Year 11-12 students*

• Measles-Mumps-Rubella (MMR) vaccine as a single dose as part of a catch-up vaccination program for students who are not fully protected.

* The Parent Information Kits contain a consent form, information sheet and privacy statement that details how personal information will be collected, stored and utilised. Parent Information Kits will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to their child's school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at <u>www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation</u>.

Students who miss being vacinated due to absence, will be offered any doses they have missed as the opportunity arises during the year.

Please note that for HPV vaccine only, parents/guardians must record their Medicare Number (all 10 digits and the 11th number beside the child's name) on the consent form, as this is required to record the student's information on the National HPV Vaccination Register and (for female students only) link to the National or State Cervical Screening Program.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic. Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination

A new school pass application is required when a student changes name, school and/or address.
