PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

EXTERNAL VALIDATION

On 3 June 2021, The Forest High School participated in external validation. In preparation for this meeting the school prepared, reviewed and annotated a body of evidence that verified the school's Self-Assessment in relation to the School Excellence Framework. This evidence bank was submitted for external validation by a Principal School Leadership and Peer Principal, who validated our self-assessment across all of the elements with the exception of Learning Culture and Educational Leadership, where the panel confirmed that our evidence indicated that our school is operating at the Excelling stage.

A number of elements were identified by both the school and the panel for future improvement:

Wellbeing

Build a collective sense of purpose and use of strategies to support student learning and well-being through a systemic approach to support staff and students. Support staff to effectively implement our positive behaviour for learning model and their understanding and application of the Behaviour policy. Teachers are integral to the success of well-being and learning. Enable differentiated learning opportunities for all staff to support their needs through staff supporting staff.

Curriculum

Explore integrated opportunities to target disengaged students. Further develop opportunities for High Potential and Gifted Students.

Educational Leadership

Identify coaching and/or mentoring opportunities through developing school leadership practices for all staff.

Data Skills and Use

Develop teaching experts to better understand individual learning needs through use of data to inform practice. Starting with the baseline of what students know and then taking student to the next level of understanding through a range of data including well-being data.

I want to acknowledge and thank the External Validation Team led by Ms Mirjana Simic, who developed the evidence sets and our final submission, for their hard work and dedication.








LANGUAGES








YEAR 11

This term our Yer 11 students completed their first Research Style Task in line with the new HSC assessment guidelines. The Standard students research the maths behind buying a car. Information included the factors to consider when choosing a car, the details and specifications, the safety rating, the additional costs when purchasing and insurance. The Advanced students researched various functions using Desmos and were asked to design a logo for a company using a variety of graphs restricting the domains to form their logo. YEAR 12

Year 12 – This term our Year 12 Standard students did their Research Task on Networks which is one of the new topics included in Standard Mathematics. They were asked to design Networks for school called Mathmore High School to best lay computer cables. This was a difficult concept and we were very pleased with the results submitted.

The Advanced classes did an investigation task on Statistics and researched the Wisdom of the Crowd theory and looked at correlation. We were very impressed with the range of different ideas from the make up of colours to baseball scores and the perimeter of computer generated shapes.






































GIRLS RUGBY LEAGUE DAY

Each class took turns to visit one of the Immersive Classrooms themed around rainforest, desert and woodland habitats at the Taronga Institute. During these lessons the students were able to have close-up encounters with a few of the animals adapted to those environments whilst reinforcing what they had already learnt at school about animal adaptations and classification. For the remainder of the day, the students enjoyed the sunshine and each other's company whilst searching for various animals to investigate enclosure designs and how they relate to the adaptations of the animals in them and identify the common characteristics of the different classes of animals.



























YEAR 11 SCIENCE GIBBERAGONG EXCURSION

On Friday 18 June, 45 students were dragged away from the 60th anniversary celebrations (sorry about that by the way...) for a day at the Gibberagong Education Centre at Bobbin Head. It was the field study part of the major depth assessment for the Biology students who are looking at the impact of Southern Brown Bandicoots on the ecosystem. They had to do a comparative assessment on two locations to determine which is the most likely area to find the Bandicoots as part of a fox abatement program. This involved a super fun 5 km hike through the beautiful National Park and the hands on use of a number of scientific instruments to determine biotic and abiotic conditions for each site. Next term, the students will need to produce a scientific report of their findings. We ran into some of the colourful wildlife of the region (Kangaroos and Parrots - not snakes, spiders or ticks fortunately) and got a special perspective on the Aboriginal connection to the area.
