DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

YEAR 10 SUBJECT SELECTION

Year 10 recently commenced their subject selection process for the Higher School Certificate.

This process commenced with report and target setting interviews. This involved an analysis of report results and small group target setting for semester two. The most striking data was around the reduction in negative incidents, down to a record low for a Year 10 group. Conversely, students demonstrating consistent respect, responsibility, and personal best in their report outcomes continues to exponentially grow. Our Year 10 Adviser, Ms. Courtney Turner, has done an outstanding job working with these students during this difficult phase of adolescents, and they are developing into mature young adults. We are so very proud of them.

Students and parents attended an information evening, Navigating the HSC, that explored the different course options, the difference between the HSC credential and an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank, and how to select a pattern of study that is right for you.

Students have also received advice from the Careers Adviser on different HSC and post-school options, including University, TAFE, Private Colleges, Traineeships, Apprenticeships, and School Based Apprenticeships.

Year 10 students then embarked on a week of work experience where students received placements in fields as diverse as medicine, construction, architecture, hospitality, media, and retail.

On their return from work experience students and their parents met with teachers to discuss their options for HSC study and these preferences have been inputted into our timetable system. Our preference-based system ensures our timetable reflects the interests of all students. Students will find out which HSC courses are running early in Term 3.

Finally, the Stage 5 Music Night was the absolute highlight of the year to date. The diversity of performance and the professionalism of the musicians and entertainment crew drew rapturous applause from the capacity crowd throughout the evening. It was also wonderful to see so many students in the audience to support their friends. Footage of the evening is currently being edited by our entertainment crew and we would look forward to sharing this with our whole school community.





YEAR 12 TRIAL EXAMINATIONS AND CAMP

Year 12 are about to enter the final term of their HSC study. This is an exciting and nerve-wracking time for many.

Our Trial Examinations take place in Weeks 3 and 4 of Term 3. Students have been issued with a timetable for their Trial Examinations and have received guidance on how to prepare for their examinations. In a nutshell, visit the NESA examinations website, practice past papers, and use the standards packages* to understand the different range of answers. Our Trial Examinations are run by the same team of HSC invigilators who will be running the HSC later this year, so every aspect of this experience will be a replica of what students can expect in October.

We encourage all students to make individual or group bookings with our Trailblazers in preparation for their examinations. Their expertise in high impact strategies is invaluable. Year 12 students will also have a study day on Friday July 29th, so no timetabled classes will be running on this day.

Year 12 also had their much belated Year 10 camp. It was awesome to see so many excited faces depart for The Great Aussie Bush Camp on June 27th. Their patience and understanding of the challenges and delays we have faced made this camp even more special.

*A standards package has samples of real student work from HSC examinations, with the marks they received. The packages have different standards of student work, so you can see a range of band results.

YEAR 8 SUBJECT SELECTIONS

Year 8 will have much to look forward to next term. Most importantly, they will have the opportunity to choose three elective courses to commence their Stage 5 studies in 2023. Students will select two electives from our 200-hour course options (studied over two years) and one elective from our short course options (studied for one year and open to students in years 9 and 10). Keep you eye out for important dates and information on this process at the start of next term.






ENRICHMENT


Thank you to all our Executive Team for the work they do behind the scenes that largely goes unseen. I also thank every contribution from the larger school community that continues to make our school a better place.
