








Year 12 Film Day

Empowered End of Year EAL/D Excursion

What a fantastic big day out EAL/D students from The Forest High School had last week as they travelled to the Seymour Centre (Sydney University) and were blown away by a series of powerfully harrowing and evocative performances of refugee teens from across the globe, as they shared their intimate journeys of



hope, sacrifice and resilience. The play featured a series of real-life first-hand escape stories, told by the brave teens who experienced them. Our students were captivated by the moving performances, and appreciated the vulnerability of all the performers from the Congo to Syria and Afghanistan to Iraq. Thank you to the Treehouse Theatre and all the very incredible refugees for sharing their histories with us. It was a lifechanging experience as our students gained true insight into the struggles for survival that many children must go through. We then had a delicious Taste Safari experience in Chinatown, where students tasted the finest Asian street foods, delicacies and home-made dishes from a range of family-owned restaurants. Our students got to experience a wide range of Asian food from Korean fried chicken, to traditional Chinese dumplings and exotic bubble tea for dessert. We learnt all about the history of Chinatown and the vibrant and hardworking community that has made Chinatown a truly inspiring cultural landmark for our city. Our students enjoyed learning about the history of some of their favourite foods like Korean fried chicken, and the rich knowledge our tour guides shared with us. 
Year 12 Food Technology


























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Hats off to Teachers

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
