STAFF DEVELOPMENT DAYS

Our focus for our Staff Development Days was Explicit Teaching. Explicit teaching practices involve teachers clearly showing students what to do and how to do it. Students who experience explicit teaching practices make greater learning gains than students who do not experience these practices. As soon as students walk into classes they are to take out their workbook and write down the learning intention/focus for that particular lesson. Please ensure your child has a workbook for each of their courses. During the Staff Development Days, we also spent time analysing last year's HSC results identifying areas of strength and areas needing attention. In 2022, we had over 10% of students who sat the HSC examinations achieve an ATAR over 90. Most students returned after the results were announced to thank their teachers and discuss plans for the future. I'm sure we will see many of these students in the years to come. Forest High School alumni regularly drop back into our school to talk with their past teachers or to volunteer for different school events such as musicals and Open Nights.

MOBILE PHONES

This week students in Years 7-10 engaged in classes and connected on the playground without their mobile phones. Walking around the playground it was great to see students talking, playing ball games and some students just sitting quietly enjoying the nice weather. There is a delay on the YONDR pouches. Step 1 – Teacher will record the incident on Sentral. The student will be notified of this.

Step 2 – The phone will be collected by a member of the senior executive and parent contacted to come and collect the phone at a time that is mutually convenient.

INFECTIOUS ILLNESSES

We wish to advise you that a student who will be attending Forest High in 2023 is currently susceptible to infectious illnesses. This student's ongoing health is at risk if he/she comes into contact with infectious illnesses, in particular: whooping cough, shingles, chicken pox, measles or mumps. If your son or daughter is suspected of having one of these illnesses, it is very important that he/she does not attend school. It is also important that while your child is unwell, he/she remains at home until he/she is no longer contagious. Information on infectious conditions can be found on national health websites, e.g. <u>www.health.gov.au</u> or alternatively, contact your local GP.

If your child has whooping cough, shingles, chicken pox, measles or mumps or is suspected of having an illness, please contact the school immediately. This will allow the school to assess the probable contact and, therefore, exposure of our student. Notification will then be given to parents and medical specialists. As a school community, we value your support in relation to the well being of all our students. Please do not hesitate to contact Ms Harper, Head Teacher Administration if you have any questions.

VACCINATIONS

Is your child in Year 7 or Year 10?

Provide your consent for their routine school vaccinations online.

In Year 7, students are offered vaccines for diphtheria-tetanuspertussis (dTpa) and human papillomavirus (HPV). In Year 10, students are offered the meningococcal ACWY vaccine.

To provide online consent, you will need:

- The link provided by our school (Year 7 early Term 1, Year 10 early Term 2)
- Your Service NSW log-in details
- Medicare card details for you and your child

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card, consent can still be provided by requesting a paperbased consent form directly from our school.

The first clinic for Year 7 and catch-up vaccinations is on Tuesday 28th March.
