PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Twice each term we produce a newsletter. The purpose of the newsletter is to showcase the many activities that have taken place over the last 5 weeks. Enjoy.

WORKSHOP FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS

Last week under the leadership of Ms Weatherall we had a group of Year 10 students deliver an imaginative writing workshop with students at North Balgowlah Public School. Andrew X, Charlie B, London H, Ty W and Jared F impressed all with their engaging approach. The gifted public speakers provided a warm and inspiring environment for the primary students to put their creative writing skills into action. Now in its third year, the highly acclaimed Kids Teaching Kids program offered a hands on and collaborative experience where all students were engaged in community learning that developed their writing and critical thinking skills.

YEAR 8 VALID - STRONG RESULTS

The VALID 8 results were distributed to students earlier this week. VALID 8 is an online assessment completed by students in Term 4 of Year 8 and assesses their understanding of the Science curriculum across Stage 4 (Year 7 and 8). Here are some of the highlights:



- 45.6% of our students were awarded the top two levels in VALID 8 (Level 5 and 6) compared to 30% of students across the state.
- 79.6% of our students achieved a Level 4 or above indicating they are achieving Stage 4 outcomes in the VALID 8 test. This is compared to 64% across the state.

VALID 10 is also completed by students in Year 10 at the end of Term 3 each year and allows us to track students' growth in Science understanding across Year 7-10. This year VALID 10 results for 2022 showed that 73.4% of students in this cohort made above expected growth in their Science understanding based on their results in VALID 8 and VALID 10. This is a continuing improvement from recent years as in 2019 and 2020 there were 59.6% and 70.4% of students gaining above expected growth respectively. VALID 10 was not completed in 2021 due to COVID lockdowns.

CANVAS AND SENTRAL

Canvas is our student learning platform where students can find assessment tasks, submit work and follow units of work. Sentral is our parent communication platform. Here parents can explain their child's absences, book parent teacher evenings, view the school calendar for whole school events and view their child's timetable. Homework is NOT posted on Sentral. If wanting to contact a teacher please email theforest-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au and clearly state who you would like to direct the email to. Our communication flowchart is on the next page.




A WARM WELCOME BACK TO OUR FOREST HIGH COMMUNITY IN 2023

MOBILE PHONES

UNIFORM

Students are expected to be in full school uniform, and it has been great to see so many students wear their uniform with pride. A reminder that students need to be in full school uniform and wear black leather shoes. Our sports uniform is to be worn only during PE lessons and during Sport. Students are to come to school in their uniform and then change in their sports uniform for PE lessons. Students who are out of uniform will need to see their Deputy (myself - Years 8, 10 & 12) and Ms Johnson (Years 7, 9 & 11) for a note. If students are out of uniform without a reason, they will attend a detention. We look forward to seeing students continue to take pride in wearing their uniform.

MATHS

Welcome back to 2023. The Mathematics staff said goodbye to Mrs O'Donnell who retired at the end of last year but are very excited to welcome our new staff member Mrs Andresakis.

Term 1 has seen classes settle back into routine. All students should now have a calculator, work book and a textbook on loan for the year. We have encouraged students to use the online version of the textbook at home and leave the textbooks in class. Students in Years 7 to 10 have started using Mathspace and Mathsonline and we encourage them to use these programs on a regular basis. Homework is recorded in Canvas for students and parents to check. The Mathematics staff run a Help Desk every Monday at lunchtime in E1007 for any students requiring some extra assistance with classwork or homework.

CALCULATORS

Please remind students to bring a calculator every lesson. We use the Casio fx-82AU-PLUSII second edition. These are available for \$30 at school with complimentary engraving. Please pay via the school website.

MATHEMATICS OLYMPIAD

Students in 7D, and 8A and 8B will soon be given a note about the Mathematics Olympiad. This is a 5 week competition run through Terms 2 and 3, testing students' problem solving skills. Any Year 7 students not in 7D but who would like to join the Olympiad team need to come to the Mathematics Staffroom to collect a note.

MATHEMATICS COMPETITION

Notes are also available for the Mathematics Competition. This will be held in Term 3. There are 3 competitions - Junior (Years 7 and 8), Intermediate (Years 9 and 10) and Senior (Years 11 and 12). Students who enjoy problem solving and wish to challenge their mathematical ability should ask their Mathematics teacher for a note.

QUICKSMART


Our first round of students in Year 8 have started the Quicksmart program. This program focuses on building confidence with basic



number facts such as the timestables and general classroom skills such as setting out. There is a different group of students chosen each term.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN tests for Years 7 and 9 will be online again this year and will run in Weeks 8 and 9 of Term 1. The students will do revision in their Mathematics class to assist in their preparation for these tests. We will also do a more formal practice test with Year 7 and 9 in Week 6 this term. If any parents would also like to assist with preparation there are revision books available at most newsagents or I would recommend utilising Mathspace and Mathsonline for revision.



We ask all parents to assist by ensuring students have the equipment required each lesson. Students often need a few reminders. Please look through their workbooks on a weekly basis. Ask questions about the work being done and praise neat and completed work. Discuss the use of Mathematics in your job and in daily life. Please contact your student's class teacher if you have any concerns during the year.




TAS FACULTY UPDATE

TECHNOLOGY MANDATORY (TEXTILES)

Students recently completed their Onguard Safety Training Units (an online safety teaching, learning & training program) used at The Forest High School. As a result, they have safely started their textile project 'In the Hood'. Students worked collaboratively in small teams with PDF patterns to assemble pieces creating templates for their textile project. Using their numeracy skills, students could correctly measure and solve problems to finalise their patterns, ready for production.

cash/envelope ordering

Your school prefers orders to be placed online. However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).



Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.



Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned approximately 6 weeks after the day of photography. Please note this delivery timeframe is dependent on proofing and additional photography days at your school.

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.
