#### National Leader in Shakespeare Education

Our Head Teacher English, Sarah Peachman is one of 30 teachers from across Australia awarded a mentorship with Bell Shakespeare for 2024. Bell Shakespeare is Australia's national theatre company specialising in the works of Shakespeare and his contemporaries. Established by renowned Actor/Director John Bell, what began in a circus tent in Sydney in 1990 has grown into a theatre company with unrivalled reach and impact, delivering mainstage productions and an education and outreach program to every state and territory, ensuring classic theatre experiences are accessible to all Australians. Mrs Peachman went through a selection process at the end of last year and has been part of workshops this week. The knowledge, skills and creative ways of teaching Shakespeare will benefit our students in English classes. In years 9 and 10, Shakespeare is a compulsory part of the curriculum. We look forward to hearing about the workshops when Mrs Peachman returns.



Students wishing to be placed in our HPGE class for the intellectual domain in Year 7 2025 must first sit this test.

The HPGE Test is for local (in area) enrolments only.

The Year 7 2025 HPGE class will be determined after close examination of the test results and the student's Year 5 NAPLAN results and Year 5 school report.

The Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) Test consists of three parts:

- The verbal section measures a child's ability to remember and transform sequences of English words, to understand them and to make inferences and judgments about them.
- The quantitative section measures a child's understanding of basic quantitative concepts and relationships.
- The non-verbal section measures reasoning using pictures and geometric shapes. This section reduces the impact of language on a student's score.
- The composite score is a total score for all three batteries.
