# Year 7 and 11 Parent Teacher Interviews

Many thanks to all staff, parents and students who attended Tuesday evening's Parent-Teacher Night. These discussions are useful in providing an update as to how your child is progressing in each of their courses. At assemblies we regularly talk to students about focusing on the things within their control. It might be useful to loop back with your child and confirm what their next steps will be. Focusing on 1-2 behaviours that can then become a routine, should place them on the path of continual improvement.

#### Examples include:

- Spending a specific amount of time each weekday afternoon revising what they learnt earlier in the day.
- Starting an assessment task when they first receive the notification and talking with their teacher the following day if anything is unclear.
- Coming to school each day with all required equipment.

 Staying back each Monday afternoon in the Library to work on assignments or to revise classwork.



## Diversity and Inclusion Meeting

Thanks to Mrs Coleman, Mr Argue and the parents who joined Wednesday evening's meeting. Mrs Coleman led a session on C-Pens. Whether it is dyslexia, visual impairments, or anything else, a reading disability is challenging. C-Pens are designed to promote active independent reading, understanding, and learning. Students scan the text with the C-Pen through their headphones and can decipher sentences or individual words. With the support of the P&C we have a number of these devices that can be loaned by students with additional learning needs. Please reach out to Mrs Coleman if you have questions.

#### Messaging to students at Senior Assembly

At Tuesday's senior assembly, we spoke about students taking charge of their day. I provided different examples of how this might be done.


The first message is a Growth Coaching strategy which involves students plotting their confidence level on the scale for a particular course. If a student was to indicate that they are sitting on a 6 for Mathematics, they could ask themselves.

To move to a '7' what would be an action I would need to take?


Note that the focus is about moving one place at a time on the scale. Taking small steps overtime will lead to routines being established and maintained.



I also spoke with students about how they are planning their week. The simple task of spending time to plan the week ahead will hopefully mean that the most important and urgent activities are being met and cognitive load is reduced by allocating time and space for other tasks to be completed.



Students were also reminded that the section of their reports titled Behavioural Expectations – Social and Learning Skills is an area where their improved routines will be recognised. Students are at all different levels academically. What we all have in common is the ability to put in effort.
