Academic Competitions

High achieving students in Years 7 to 10 are invited to participate in the 2024 English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Digital Technologies competitions. If students want extra opportunities to gain a measure of their achievement in an external assessment situation or to become accustomed to competitive external testing with time constraints,

they are encouraged enter the ICAS competitions. Aboriginal Studies Walking Tour

On Wednesday, Year 10 and Year 11 Aboriginal Studies were guided by the Guringai Aboriginal Tour on a journey of discovery in Bantry Bay Aboriginal sites. Here students learnt how the local Aboriginal ancestors cared for the land. The tour involved a visit to a cave with stencil art and a sandstone engravings site where the guides showed how the art is done, how the carvings are made and how to read the site. We thank Uncle Laurie Bimson who is a Guringai descendant and experienced Aboriginal guide. This excursion provided an opportunity for Year 10 and Year 11 Aboriginal Studies students to engage in community consultation, which is an essential element of their case study assessments.
